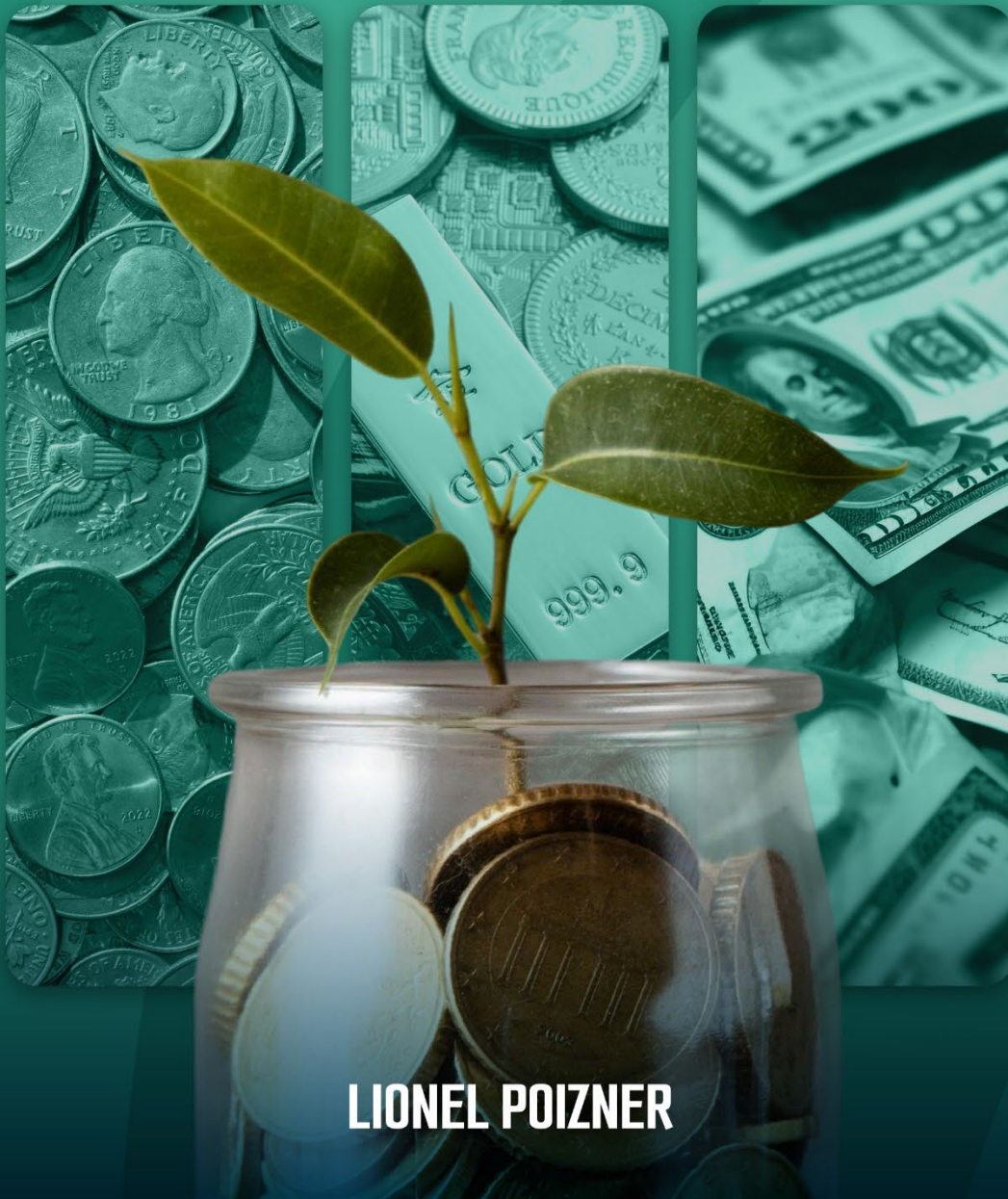

# 1. Low-Effort, Rental Hustles (15 Hustles)

These side hustles are perfect for beginners who want to start with minimal time, effort, or money.

In this first group of side hustles these listings offer a variety of rental side hustles that make use of assets you already own. Yes, it is possible to go into these side hustles if you do not already own the equipment, but this then requires a significant investment on your part. The idea here is to leverage equipment and stuff you already own to start making money. These side hustles are good in that they provide opportunities for passive or semi-passive income.

## 1.1 Renting Out Your Tools / Landscaping Equipment

**Description:** Rent out tools such as power drills, saws, ladders, or gardening equipment to homeowners or contractors in need.

- **Effort:** Low. Requires organizing tools and managing rentals.
- **Investment:** None if you already own the tools.
- **Potential Earnings:** \$50–\$500/month depending on the tools and demand.

- **Effort:** Low. Requires occasional communication with renters.
- **Investment:** None if you already own the property.
- **Potential Earnings:** \$50–\$500/month depending on location (urban areas earn more).
- **Setup Time:** 1–2 days to list the spot and advertise.
- **Pros:** Passive income, minimal ongoing effort.

- **Effort:** Low. Requires maintaining the space and managing renters.
- **Investment:** None if you already own the property.
- **Potential Earnings:** \$50–\$500/month depending on size and location.
- **Setup Time:** 1–2 days to list and advertise the space.
- **Pros:** Passive income, minimal maintenance required.
- **Cons:** Limited to available space, potential liability for stored items.

- **Cons:** Limited to local buyers, weather dependent, location dependent.

The more you work the more you can make.

## 3. Online Side Hustles (8 Hustles)

### 3.1 Completing Online Surveys

**Description:** Earn money by participating in online surveys and sharing your opinions with companies conducting market research.

- **Effort:** Low. Requires answering questions online.
- **Investment:** None.
- **Potential Earnings:** \$10–\$150/month depending on how many surveys you complete.
- **Setup Time:** 10–15 minutes to create an account on survey platforms.
- **Pros:** Flexible, no special skills required.
- **Cons:** Low earning potential, some surveys may take considerable time for minimal payout.

All the research studies I participated in were for medical trials of new drugs to help control type 2 diabetes. Obviously, it is better not to require this kind of trial but at least it can help you financially and perhaps by improving the performance of your medications.

- **Effort:** Low. Requires attending sessions online or in person and providing feedback.
- **Investment:** None.
- **Potential Earnings:** \$50–\$500/month depending on the type and frequency of studies.
- **Setup Time:** 10–30 minutes to apply and register with research platforms.
- **Pros:** High hourly pay, interesting and varied topics.
- **Cons:** Limited availability, may require travel for in-person studies.

- **Potential Earnings:** \$10–\$50 per test depending on length and complexity.
- **Setup Time:** 10–15 minutes to create an account on testing platforms.
- **Pros:** Flexible schedule, good pay for time invested.
- **Cons:** Availability of tests may vary.

It is hard to make money. A lot of the games that say you can make money are assuming that you win the game. The odds of winning of course are very low. A lot of the games will not even let you withdraw money if you do win. Be very careful with this one.

- **Effort:** Low. It requires playing games and achieving certain milestones.
- **Investment:** None.
- **Potential Earnings:** \$10–\$200/month depending on the platform and time invested.
- **Setup Time:** 10–15 minutes to create an account.
- **Pros:** Fun and entertaining, flexible schedule.
- **Cons:** Low earning potential unless you dedicate significant time.

### 3.6 Affiliate Marketing

**Description:** Partner with businesses and promote their products or services on your social media, blog, or website, earning a commission on each sale made through your referral link. *Note:* this is one of my favorite side hustles of all time and I still sell affiliate products to this day.

- **Effort:** Low to Medium. Requires creating content and promoting products.
- **Investment:** None. May use free social media accounts to drive traffic and funnels hosted by the affiliate program host.
- **Potential Earnings:** Highly variable, depending on your audience size and engagement.
- **Setup Time:** A few days to set up accounts and find affiliate programs.
- **Pros:** Can be passive income, wide range of products to promote.
- **Cons:** Requires building an audience, commission-based income.

### 3.7 Delivery Gigs (Food, Parcels, Groceries)

**Description:** Use your car, bike, or scooter to deliver food, parcels, or groceries for various companies.

- **Effort:** Low to Medium. Requires driving or cycling, following delivery instructions, and managing your time.
- **Investment:** None. If you already own a vehicle, the investment is minimal.
- **Potential Earnings:** \$200 - \$1000+/month depending on the hours you put in and the demand in your area.
- **Setup Time:** 1-2 days to sign up and get approved on delivery platforms.
- **Pros:** Flexible hours, relatively easy work.
- **Cons:** Can be physically demanding, wear and tear on your vehicle, fluctuating earnings.

### 3.8 Print on Demand

**Description:** Design and sell products like T-shirts, mugs, and posters online without holding any inventory.

*Note:* I have created and sold print on demand products more than a few times over the last few years. Most of it was designed and sold as merchandise to promote one of my brands. I used it to promote a political party, a not-for-profit, and one of my digital businesses. It is not hard to create products. The big challenge is getting people to find your brand and then buy them. It helps a great deal to build and have your own community that will then buy your merch to support the brand. This works amazingly well when done properly! ... Lionel

- **Effort:** Low to Medium. Requires designing products and setting up an online store.
- **Investment:** None. Most platforms offer free sign-up and only charge when a product is sold. There are some platforms that offer a premium membership with reduced fees paid on sales, cheaper merchant fees, etc.
- **Potential Earnings:** Variable, depending on your designs and marketing efforts.
- **Setup Time:** A few days to set up a store and create designs.
- **Pros:** No inventory management, wide range of products to sell.
- **Cons:** Lower profit margins, reliant on platform for production and shipping.

### 3.9 Create and Sell Digital Products

**Description:** Design and sell digital products such as templates, printables, e-books, or online courses. *Note:* I still do this one very often. Don't believe me? Well you are reading one of my products right now 😊 ... Lionel

- **Effort:** Medium. Requires creating the product once and then selling it repeatedly.
- **Investment:** Low. Software or tools may be required, but many free options are available.
- **Potential Earnings:** \$100 - \$1000+/month depending on the product and marketing.
- **Setup Time:** A few days to create the product and set up a sales platform.
- **Pros:** Can be passive income, scalable without inventory costs.
- **Cons:** Requires initial effort to create a high-quality product, marketing is essential.

### 3.10 Social Media Content Creation / Manage Social Media for Local Businesses

**Description:** Create content for social media platforms like TikTok, Instagram, or YouTube and monetize your content through ads, sponsorships, or affiliate marketing. Help local businesses manage their social media presence by creating content, scheduling posts, and engaging with followers.

- **Effort:** Medium. Requires understanding social media marketing, creating engaging content and building an audience.
- **Investment:** None. May be done with a smartphone and free editing software.
- **Potential Earnings:** \$15 - \$50+/hour depending on your skills and experience. Highly variable, depending on your audience size and engagement.
- **Setup Time:** A few days to set up accounts and create content.
- **Pros:** Flexible hours, can work from anywhere, may be highly profitable, a very creative outlet.
- **Cons:** Requires consistent effort, excellent communication skills & building an audience takes a lot of time and effort.

This now concludes Chapter #3. I have personally experimented with all these hustles, and some have been very good, and others have been a total waste of time. The one I had the least success with was playing games for money hustle. I have found most of these hustles are total scams and, in most cases, (not all cases) I lost money. The one hustle in this list that I had the most success with is the Affiliate Marketing Side Hustle. I started with this hustle when I wanted to experiment with an online side gig. I did not have any products of my own, so I applied for permission to sell other people's products and receive commission for my hard work.

I started and it was a tough go. Then as time progressed, I discovered a lot of tools that were available that helped me bring in my prospects and get them to make purchases. Now a new platform exists called [Offerlab](#) and it is amazing. It is free to use and has everything all in one place. If you want to try affiliate marketing, it is the way to go. There is some great training available and once you know what you are doing it is a lot easier to make it all happen. I still work this side gig myself. Only now do I not only sell other people's products, I let other affiliates sell my products too!

**Description:** Teach students remotely in subjects you're knowledgeable about, such as math, science, or languages.

- **Effort:** Medium. Requires preparing lessons and teaching online.
- **Investment:** None.
- **Potential Earnings:** \$15–\$50/hour depending on the subject, platform & your availability.
- **Setup Time:** 1–2 weeks to create a profile and get approved by tutoring platforms.
- **Pros:** High earning potential, rewarding work, flexible hours, leverage your existing skills.
- **Cons:** Requires subject expertise, good communication skills. Finding clients can be challenging.

- **Effort:** Medium. Requires completing tasks efficiently and meeting deadlines.
- **Investment:** None.
- **Potential Earnings:** \$10–\$30/hour depending on your skills and the client's needs.
- **Setup Time:** 1–2 days to create a profile and apply for jobs.
- **Pros:** Flexible hours, work from home.
- **Cons:** Requires time management and communication skills.

### 5.1 House Sitting

**Description:** Earn money by taking care of someone's home while they are away. Duties may include collecting mail, watering plants, and ensuring the property is secure.

- **Effort:** Low. Requires being present at the house and performing basic tasks.
- **Investment:** None.
- **Potential Earnings:** \$25–\$50/day depending on location and responsibilities.
- **Setup Time:** 1–2 days to create a profile and start applying for gigs.
- **Pros:** Free accommodation (if live-in), minimal responsibilities.
- **Cons:** Requires trust, opportunities may be sporadic.

- **Cons:** Requires patience, may involve long hours.
